Section 6614. Change in Title - Certification. Where the title of any real estate is finally settled in a district court or by a decision of an appellate court, or where title to real estate is changed by judgment, decree, will, private conveyance, or otherwise, the auditor of the county in which said real estate is located, under the seal of said court, to the county auditor of the county in which said land is located.
