

Section 606.14, *Change in Title—Certification*. Where the title of any real estate is finally established in any person or persons by a judgment or decree of the district court or by a decision of an appellate court, or where title to real estate is changed by judgment, decree, will, proceeding, or order in a court, the clerk of the district court shall certify the same, probate, the clerk of the district court to the county auditor of the county in which said land is located.
