Section 606.14. *Change in Title* — Certification. When the title of any real estate is finally established in any person or persons by a judgment or decree of the district court or by a decision of an appellate court, or where title to real estate is changed by judgment, decree, will, proceeding, or order in probate, the clerk of the district court shall certify the same to the county auditor of the county, to the county auditor of the county in which said land is located.
