Section 636.14. Change in Title. — Certification. Where the title to any real estate is changed by a judgment or decree of the district court or by a decision of an appellate court, or where title to real estate is changed by a judgment or decree of the district court or by a decision of an appellate court, the clerk of the district court shall certify the same under the seal of said court, to the county auditor of the county in which said land is located.
